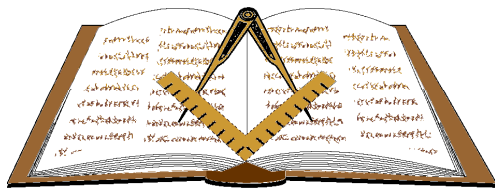
FROM THE EAST
